

**93RD ANNUAL ACADEMY AWARDS®**  
**OSCAR® NOMINATIONS FACT SHEET**

**Best Motion Picture of the Year:**

***The Father*** (Sony Pictures Classics) - David Parfitt, Jean-Louis Livi and Philippe Carcassonne, producers - This is the second Best Picture nomination for David Parfitt. He won an Oscar for *Shakespeare in Love* (1998).

This is the first nomination for both Jean-Louis Livi and Philippe Carcassonne.

***Judas and the Black Messiah*** (Warner Bros.) - Shaka King, Charles D. King and Ryan Coogler, producers - This is the first Best Picture nomination for all three.

***Mank*** (Netflix) - Ceán Chaffin, Eric Roth and Douglas Urbanski, producers - This is the third Best Picture nomination for Ceán Chaffin. Her other nominations were for *The Curious Case of Benjamin Button* (2008) and *The Social Network* (2010).

This is the first Best Picture nomination for Eric Roth.

This is the second Best Picture nomination for Douglas Urbanski. His other nomination was for *Darkest Hour* (2017).

***Minari*** (A24) - Christina Oh, producer - This is her first nomination.

***Nomadland*** (Searchlight) - Frances McDormand, Peter Spears, Mollye Asher, Dan Janvey and Chloé Zhao, producers - This is the first Best Picture nomination for Frances McDormand, Mollye Asher and Chloé Zhao.

This is the second Best Picture nomination for Peter Spears. His other nomination was for *Call Me by Your Name* (2017).

This is the second Best Picture nomination for Dan Janvey. His other nomination was for *Beasts of the Southern Wild* (2012).

***Promising Young Woman*** (Focus Features) - Ben Browning, Ashley Fox, Emerald Fennell and Josey McNamara, producers - This is the first Best Picture nomination for all four.

***Sound of Metal*** (Amazon Studios) - Bert Hamelinck and Sacha Ben Harroche, producers - This is the first nomination for both.

***The Trial of the Chicago 7*** (Netflix) - Marc Platt and Stuart Besser, producers - This is the third Best Picture nomination for Marc Platt. His other nominations were for *Bridge of Spies* (2015) and *La La Land* (2016).

This is the first nomination for Stuart Besser.

**Achievement in Directing:**

***Another Round*** - **Thomas Vinterberg** - This is his first nomination.

***Mank*** - **David Fincher** - This is his third nomination. He was previously nominated in this category for *The Curious Case of Benjamin Button* (2008) and *The Social Network* (2010).

***Minari*** - **Lee Isaac Chung** - This is his first nomination in this category. He is also nominated in the Original Screenplay category this year.

***Nomadland*** - **Chloé Zhao** - This is her first nomination in this category. She is also nominated in the Best Picture, Film Editing and Adapted Screenplay categories this year.

***Promising Young Woman*** - **Emerald Fennell** - This is her first nomination in this category. She is also nominated in the Best Picture and Original Screenplay categories this year.

### **Performance by an Actor in a Leading Role:**

**Riz Ahmed** (“Ruben” in *Sound of Metal*) - This is his first nomination.

**Chadwick Boseman** (“Levee” in *Ma Rainey’s Black Bottom*) - This is his first nomination.

**Anthony Hopkins** (“Anthony” in *The Father*) - This is his sixth nomination and fourth in this category. He won the award for his leading role in *The Silence of the Lambs* (1991). He was nominated for leading roles in *The Remains of the Day* (1993) and *Nixon* (1995) and for his supporting roles in *Amistad* (1997) and *The Two Popes* (2019).

**Gary Oldman** (“Herman Mankiewicz” in *Mank*) - This is his third nomination in this category. He was nominated for leading roles in *Tinker Tailor Soldier Spy* (2011) and *Darkest Hour*, for which he won the Oscar in 2017.

**Steven Yeun** (“Jacob” in *Minari*) - This is his first nomination.

### **Performance by an Actor in a Supporting Role:**

**Sacha Baron Cohen** (“Abbie Hoffman” in *The Trial of the Chicago 7*) - This is his third nomination and first in this category. He is also nominated in the Adapted Screenplay category this year for *Borat Subsequent Moviefilm: Delivery of Prodigious Bribe to American Regime for Make Benefit Once Glorious Nation of Kazakhstan*. He was previously nominated for Adapted Screenplay for *Borat Cultural Learnings of America for Make Benefit Glorious Nation of Kazakhstan* (2006).

**Daniel Kaluuya** (“Fred Hampton” in *Judas and the Black Messiah*) - This is his second nomination and first in this category. He was nominated for his leading role in *Get Out* (2017).

**Leslie Odom, Jr.** (“Sam Cooke” in *One Night in Miami...*) - This is his first nomination in this category. He is also nominated in the Original Song category this year.

**Paul Raci** (“Joe” in *Sound of Metal*) - This is his first nomination.

**Lakeith Stanfield** (“Bill O’Neal” in *Judas and the Black Messiah*) - This is his first nomination.

### **Performance by an Actress in a Leading Role:**

**Viola Davis** (“Ma Rainey” in *Ma Rainey’s Black Bottom*) - This is her fourth nomination and second in this category. She won an Oscar for her supporting role in *Fences* (2016), and was nominated for her supporting role in *Doubt* (2008) and her leading role in *The Help* (2011).

**Andra Day** (“Billie Holiday” in *The United States vs. Billie Holiday*) - This is her first nomination.

**Vanessa Kirby** (“Martha” in *Pieces of a Woman*) - This is her first nomination.

**Frances McDormand** (“Fern” in *Nomadland*) - This is her third nomination in this category and her seventh overall, including her Best Picture nomination this year. She won Oscars for her leading roles in *Fargo* (1996) and *Three Billboards outside Ebbing, Missouri* (2017). Her other nominations were for supporting roles in *Mississippi Burning* (1988), *Almost Famous* (2000) and *North Country* (2005).

**Carey Mulligan** (“Cassandra” in *Promising Young Woman*) - This is her second nomination in this category. She was nominated for her leading role in *An Education* (2009).

### **Performance by an Actress in a Supporting Role:**

**Maria Bakalova** (“Tutar Sagdiyev” in *Borat Subsequent Moviefilm: Delivery of Prodigious Bribe to American Regime for Make Benefit Once Glorious Nation of Kazakhstan*) - This is her first nomination.

**Glenn Close** (“Mamaw” in *Hillbilly Elegy*) - This is her eighth nomination and fourth in this category. She was nominated for her supporting roles in *The World According to Garp* (1982), *The Big Chill* (1983) and *The Natural* (1984), and her leading roles in *Fatal Attraction* (1987), *Dangerous Liaisons* (1988), *Albert Nobbs* (2011) and *The Wife* (2018).

**Olivia Colman** (“Anne” in *The Father*) - This is her second nomination and first in this category. She won the Oscar for her leading role in *The Favourite* (2018).

**Amanda Seyfried** (“Marion Davies” in *Mank*) - This is her first nomination.

**Yuh-Jung Youn** (“Soonja” in *Minari*) - This is her first nomination.

### **Adapted Screenplay:**

*Borat Subsequent Moviefilm: Delivery of Prodigious Bribe to American Regime for Make Benefit Once Glorious Nation of Kazakhstan* - Screenplay by **Sacha Baron Cohen & Anthony Hines & Dan Swimer & Peter Baynham & Erica Rivinoja & Dan Mazer & Jena Friedman & Lee Kern**; Story by **Sacha Baron Cohen & Anthony Hines & Dan Swimer & Nina Pedrad** (based on a character by Sacha Baron Cohen). - This is the second nomination in this category and third overall for Sacha Baron Cohen, who is also nominated this year for his supporting role in *The Trial of the Chicago 7*. His other nomination was for the adapted screenplay for *Borat Cultural Learnings of America for Make Benefit Glorious Nation of Kazakhstan* (2006).

This is the second nomination for Anthony Hines, Peter Baynham and Dan Mazer, who were nominated for the adapted screenplay for *Borat Cultural Learnings of America for Make Benefit Glorious Nation of Kazakhstan* (2006).

This is the first nomination for Dan Swimer, Erica Rivinoja, Jena Friedman, Lee Kern and Nina Pedrad.

*The Father* - Screenplay by **Christopher Hampton** and **Florian Zeller** (based on the play by Florian Zeller). - This is the third nomination for Christopher Hampton, who won an Oscar for his adapted screenplay for *Dangerous Liaisons* (1988). His other nomination was for the adapted screenplay for *Atonement* (2007).

This is the first nomination for Florian Zeller.

*Nomadland* - Written for the screen by **Chloé Zhao** (based on the book by Jessica Bruder). - This is her first nomination in this category. She is also nominated in the Best Picture, Directing and Film Editing categories this year.

*One Night in Miami...* - Screenplay by **Kemp Powers** (based on the stage play by Kemp Powers). - This is his first nomination.

*The White Tiger* - Written for the screen by **Ramin Bahrani** (based on the book by Aravind Adiga). - This is his first nomination.

### Original Screenplay:

*Judas and the Black Messiah* - Screenplay by **Will Berson & Shaka King**; Story by **Will Berson & Shaka King** and **Kenny Lucas & Keith Lucas**. - This is the first nomination for all four.

*Minari* - Written by **Lee Isaac Chung**. - This is his first nomination in this category. He is also nominated in the Directing category this year.

*Promising Young Woman* - Written by **Emerald Fennell**. - This is her first nomination in this category. She is also nominated in the Best Picture and Directing categories this year.

*Sound of Metal* - Screenplay by **Darius Marder & Abraham Marder**; Story by **Darius Marder & Derek Cianfrance**. - This is the first nomination for all three.

*The Trial of the Chicago 7* - Written by **Aaron Sorkin**. - This is his fourth nomination. He won an Oscar for his adapted screenplay for *The Social Network* (2010) and was nominated in the same category for *Moneyball* (2011) and *Molly's Game* (2017).

### Best International Feature Film:

*Another Round* (**Denmark**) [Directed by Thomas Vinterberg] - This is the thirteenth nomination for Denmark. It won back-to-back Oscars for *Babette's Feast* (1987) and *Pelle the Conqueror* (1988), and won again for *In a Better World* (2010). Other nominations were for *Qivitoq* (1956), *Paw* (1959), *Harry and the Butler* (1961), *Waltzing Regitze* (1989), *After the Wedding* (2006), *A Royal Affair* (2012), *The Hunt* (2013), *A War* (2015) and *Land of Mine* (2016).

*Better Days* (**Hong Kong**) [Directed by Derek Kwok-cheung Tsang] - This is the third nomination for Hong Kong. Previous nominations were for *Raise the Red Lantern* (1991) and *Farewell My Concubine* (1993).

*Collective* (**Romania**) [Directed by Alexander Nanau] - This is the first nomination for Romania.

*The Man Who Sold His Skin* (**Tunisia**) [Directed by Kaouther Ben Hania] - This is the first nomination for Tunisia.

*Quo Vadis, Aida?* (**Bosnia and Herzegovina**) [Directed by Jasmila Žbanić] - This is the second nomination for Bosnia and Herzegovina. It won the Oscar in 2001 for *No Man's Land*.

### Best Animated Feature Film:

*Onward* (Walt Disney) - **Dan Scanlon** and **Kori Rae** - This is the first nomination for both.

*Over the Moon* (Netflix) - **Glen Keane**, **Gennie Rim** and **Peilin Chou** - This is the second nomination for Glen Keane and the first in this category. He won an Oscar for the animated short film *Dear Basketball* (2017).

This is the first nomination for both Gennie Rim and Peilin Chou.

*A Shaun the Sheep Movie: Farmageddon* (Netflix) - **Richard Phelan**, **Will Becher** and **Paul Kewley** - This is the first nomination for all three.

*Soul* (Walt Disney) - **Pete Docter** and **Dana Murray** - This is the ninth nomination for Pete Docter and the fourth in this category. He won Oscars for Best Animated Feature Film for *Up* (2009) and *Inside Out* (2015) and was nominated in the same category for *Monsters, Inc.* (2001). He received nominations in the Original Screenplay category for *Toy Story* (1995), *WALL-E* (2008), *Up* and *Inside Out*. He was nominated in the Animated Short Film category for *Mike's New Car* (2002).

This is the second nomination for Dana Murray and the first in this category. She was nominated for the animated short film *Lou* (2017).

*Wolfwalkers* (Apple/GKIDS) - **Tomm Moore**, **Ross Stewart**, **Paul Young** and **Stéphan Roelants** - This is the third nomination in this category for Tomm Moore. His other nominations were for *The Secret of Kells* (2009) and *Song of the Sea* (2014).

This is the first nomination for both Ross Stewart and Stéphan Roelants.

This is the second nomination in this category for Paul Young. His other nomination was for *Song of the Sea* (2014).
